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FAFSA and Dream Act Financial Aid Applications due March 2

Now that you have submitted your FAFSA or Dream Act application, be checking your email or US postal mail for instructions to set up your Student Web Grant Account. **Remember that our school district automatically submitted your GPA verification form electronically for you this year and will do so again next year.** There are 2 things students need to complete on the Web Grants portal. 1.) Identify the college that you will be attending. Do this ASAP. If you aren't sure at this point, identify the college you will MOST LIKELY be attending. You can log on and change this later if needed. In May, students will need to log on again to verify that they will be graduating. See Mrs. Cardoza for help.

Each university you applied to should be providing you with a financial aid award package this month. It may be in your portal or emailed or mailed to you. This will give specific details of ALL aid available to you from each university. Be sure to ACCEPT the award package in the university student portal only for the college that you choose to attend!

To find scholarship applications in Naviance, click on the "colleges" tab, then scroll to the bottom and click "scholarship list". When you open a specific scholarship, there will be an application available for you to download.

Many scholarships require transcripts as part of your application. Find out if they require OFFICIAL or UNOFFICIAL transcripts. Official transcripts are printed out, signed, and sealed from the Records Office. Official transcripts may be mailed, or scanned to upload to an online application. Unofficial copies may be printed by your counselor or emailed to you. Be sure to ask for either type of transcript several days ahead of time.

Some scholarships require letters of recommendation. Since scholarship programs are not connected to Naviance, the letters teachers have uploaded cannot be sent this way. You will need to ask your recommenders to print out your letter of recommendation and sign it. You can then either mail it in or scan it to upload to an online application.

Be sure to let Mrs. Cardoza know of scholarships that you are awarded so that you can be recognized at our scholarship awards night on April 30.

Although it seems like an eternity for you, realize that colleges and universities have THOUSANDS of applicants and it takes time for them to process all of those applications! It may take several weeks before your portal is updated with test scores received, transcripts, etc. Some colleges are sending out acceptance and denial letters, but many haven't completed their decision process yet. You're just going to have to be patient! Most universities will have everything finalized and communicated to you by the end of March.

What's in a Name?

It is crucial that you use your legal name on all school, college, and financial aid documents. Your legal name is what is printed on your birth certificate and/or social security card. As you transition from high school to college and the real world, you must use your legal name consistently in everything you do. This is especially important for students who have 2 last names, or go by middle names. If you have not been using your legal name at school or on any applications, you need to get that fixed immediately!

Check your college portal/email

Colleges mostly communicate with you through your student portal/account or through email. Be sure to check at least weekly. Many colleges are requesting financial aid documents, housing deposits, and other admissions requirements. Pay attention to deadlines! Your application may be cancelled or your admission may be revoked if you miss a deadline or requirement!

SAT and ACT Testing Information

Juniors should be registering for the SAT and/or ACT (both with writing) this spring. I recommend that you take it once in the spring of your junior year, and again in the fall of your senior year. Take them both, since the tests are different and you may find that you do better on one test. Colleges will only look at your highest score. Go to the websites listed above, create a username & password that you will remember, you will need to log on to these websites again!

Although there are now test dates in July and August, I do not recommend those test dates unless students have been participating in a daily test prep program for at least 6 weeks. During summer vacation, our brains tend to relax and forget academics, resulting in lower scores.

Students on free or reduced lunch are eligible for a total of 2 SAT fee waivers and 2 ACT fee waivers. It's a good idea to use one the spring of your junior year and one in the fall of your senior year. Fee waivers are available in Mrs. Cardoza's office in the counseling department. AVID students will receive their fee waivers in AVID class.

You'll have to upload a photo of yourself for the admission ticket. Don't forget to print your admission ticket and bring a photo I.D. to the test! *(Don't forget to use your legal first and last name, exactly as it is on your birth certificate.)*

Although you may not be sure where you apply to college yet, request that your scores be sent anyway! Use the codes below to have your scores sent to all CSUs and all UCs. It's free now, they will charge you later. If you end up taking the test again and getting a better score, this score will be ignored.

SAT scores: *Use code 3594 to send scores to Cal State Apply, and they are shared with ALL of the CSUs. Send scores to one UC, they will be shared with all UCs.*

ACT scores: *Send scores to one CSU and they will share with all CSUs. Send scores to one UC and they will share with all UCs.*

SAT Subject Tests

Students applying to private or very competitive universities should consider taking 2 SAT subject tests. Although not a requirement for UCs, they can help your application. Subject tests must be taken on a separate day than the regular SAT, and students are allowed to take up to 3 subject tests in one sitting. Choose the subject tests that you feel you will be most successful on. ***If you choose to take the math subject test, be sure it is Level 2.***

Preparing for the SAT and ACT Tests

There is no minimum score goal for these tests. Aim to do the very best that you can do. Higher scores tend to open more doors for college admissions and some scholarships. Remember that college admissions and scholarships are competitive, they are awarded to students with the highest scores (grades, activities, etc.).

Plan to spend at least 15-30 minutes per day studying and preparing for the test for at least a month before the test. More is better!

Kaplan SAT Test Prep Class

Juniors (and sophomores in higher level coursework) may want to register for a SAT test prep class. The class meets every Tuesday from April 12—May 31 (not June 7 as previously advertised) from 4:30—7:30 pm in room 205. Students must register in the SBO, the registration fee is \$335. Registration deadline is **March 1**. Limited to the first 30 students who register. Students must register for the SAT exam separate, and should register for the June SAT.

Eligibility in the Local Context (ELC)

Juniors meeting ELC requirements for the UC

The highest achieving 18% of the junior class will be receiving letters requesting parent permission for participation in the UC ELC program. These students class have been identified based on their successful completion of A-G coursework and GPA. After spring semester grades have posted, the top 9% will be selected by UC for ELC status.

What does this mean? Based on your past academic performance, and your GPA at the end of this semester, you may be guaranteed admission at a UC campus. UC does not guarantee which campus, it may or not be a UC that you apply to as a senior.

What do juniors need to do? If you would like our school district to submit your transcript to UC, your parent/guardian needs to sign the permission slip and **return it to Mrs. Cardoza in the counseling office before March 16, 2018**. Make sure that you apply to at least one UC campus in the fall of your senior year.

What about seniors who were on this list last year? As you begin to receive UC acceptances and denials, you may receive an acceptance from a UC campus that you did not apply to. This acceptance is based on your participation in the ELC program.

Early Assessment Program (EAP) and SBAC Testing

Juniors: your first crack at the college assessment test for CSU and MJC

All juniors will be taking the English portion, the multiple choice is embedded in the SBAC test and the essay portion will be completed in English class. Students in Secondary Math 3 or higher will take the math portion. Do the best you can on these tests—higher scores can help you in college! **Students must check the “Release Authorization” to colleges on both tests.** The scores are not used in determining your admission, they are only used in course placement. You should receive your scores during the summer or beginning of the school year in the mail. Be sure to keep them with all of your college preparation materials.

There are only 3 possible scores:

Ready—means that you qualify for college level course and do not have to take the assessment test or take remedial courses.

Conditionally Ready—means that you almost qualify for college level coursework. To be fully exempt, you must complete ERWC or IB English, or any math class higher than Advanced Algebra with a C or higher both semesters next year to be fully exempt.

Not Yet Ready—means that you need to build your skills and you will need to take the assessment tests at Community College or Summer Early Start Classes at CSU.
